Advocate for Talent Search and Other TRIO Programs

Did you know that Penn Talent Search is a federal TRIO program?

TRIO programs operate in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., the Pacific Islands, and Puerto Rico. Collectively, **more than 3,400 TRIO programs nationwide** help



nearly one million students enter and graduate from college each year. Penn Talent Search alone serves 583 students in Philadelphia.

Recently, the White House issued a **budget proposal** that would **eliminate all TRIO programs** in the coming year. Across the country, TRIO students could lose access to the academic advising, career guidance, and personal support that make success possible for so many first-generation and low-income students.

Policymakers in Congress need to hear from YOU — the TRIO students, parents, and families — about the importance of protecting Talent Search and other programs, so we can continue to support every one of our participants along their educational journey!

Opportunities for Talent Search Scholars

Philadelphia Youth Poet Laureate

Administered by the Free Library of Philadelphia, the Youth Poet Laureate program gives one exceptional young poet a platform for creative expression and civic engagement through poetry.

The Youth Poet Laureate will serve a term from September 2025 through June 2026 and will:

- Serve as a leader and champion of Philadelphia's youth poetry community
- Be mentored by 2024-2025 Philadelphia Poet Laureate, Kai Davis, as well as the 2026-2027 Philadelphia Poet Laureate who will be named in January 2026.
- Participate in community projects and events that promote poetry, literacy, arts education, and youth advocacy
- Receive a **\$1,000 stipend** to further the Youth Poet Laureate's education
- Be eligible to apply for the Regional and National Youth Poet Laureate contests administered by Urban Word NYC

Korean American Scholarship Foundation

The Korean American Scholarship Foundation (KASF) is a non-profit, volunteer-managed organization established to help meet the financial needs of Korean-American students seeking higher education.

KASE scholarships range from **\$500 to \$5,000** and are awarded by region. All applicants must be enrolled in a full time program in the U.S during the scholarship application year. If extra funds are available, descendants of American veterans who served during the Korean War may also qualify for scholarships.

The Center for Male Engagement (CME) at Community College of Philadelphia is hosting

This opportunity is open to current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders. You must be a resident of Philadelphia enrolled in high school at the time of the application, and you must not be graduating high school in 2025.

Prism Foundation Scholarship

Prism Foundation provides scholarships to empower outstanding students who are making a positive impact on the Asian & Pacific Islander and LGBTQIA+ communities. Scholarships range from **\$1000 to \$5000**, and past recipients have included both undergraduates and graduates across a spectrum of ages, gender identities, sexual orientation, racial and ethnic backgrounds, and more.

Applicants must be attending an accredited post-secondary institution in the United States in the upcoming academic year (starting in the Fall of this current year) when applying. The application is open to students who attend community college, university, and trade/ vocational school. Applicants should have a strong history of engagement within the API and/or LGBTQIA+ communities.

Called Into Growth, a four-week summer program that exposes students to college-level coursework and introduces available resources at CCP.

During the last week of the program, participants stay at Kutztown University for four days to get a taste of what it's like to live on a college campus. At the end of the program, they also receive a **\$300 stipend**.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must complete an admission application to the Community College of Philadelphia
- Must complete the College's placement test and be admitted to the College
- Must be a first-time incoming student at CCP
- Must submit the CME's summer program application
- Must attend a scheduled interview (via Zoom or in-person)
