












Penn Talent Search will host a virtual orientation for new and returning scholars, parents, and guardians.

Advocate for Talent Search and Other TRIO Programs

Did you know that Penn Talent Search is a federal TRIO program?

TRIO programs operate in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., the Pacific Islands, and Puerto Rico.

Collectively, more than 3,400 TRIO programs

<u>nationwide</u> help nearly one million students enter and graduate from college each year. Penn Talent Search alone serves 583 students in Philadelphia.

Recently, the White House issued a **budget proposal** that would **eliminate all TRIO**



programs in the coming year. Across the country, TRIO students could lose access to the academic advising, career guidance, and personal support that make success possible for so many first-generation and low-income students.

Policymakers in Congress need to hear from YOU — the TRIO students, parents, and families — about the importance of protecting Talent Search and other programs, so we can continue to support every one of our participants along their educational journey!

Opportunities for Talent Search Scholars

Gates Scholarship

The Gates Scholarship is a highly selective, last-dollar scholarship for **outstanding high school seniors from low-income households**. Each year, the scholarship is awarded to exceptional student leaders, with the intent of helping them realize their maximum potential.

Scholars will receive funding for the full cost of attendance that is not already covered by other financial aid and the Student Aid Index, as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or the methodology used by a Scholar's college or university.

To apply, students must be:

- A high school senior
- Pell-eligible
- A US citizen or permanent resident
- In good academic standing with a minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent)

Additionally, a student must plan to enroll fulltime, in a four-year degree program, at a US accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university.

Access Engineering

High school students who are **interested in STEM and engineering**, apply to be a student in Access Engineering! Participants get handson lessons every week, mentorship from Penn students, and the opportunity to explore exciting fields in science and engineering.

Access Engineering is the University of Pennsylvania's largest student-run engineering education program. The program aims to cultivate Philadelphia high school students' interest in engineering and demonstrate their capability to make meaningful change through a semester of weekend lessons at Penn Engineering's campus that introduce students to six engineering disciplines.

This program is for all students in the Philadelphia public high school district and is completely free to attend. Lunch and SEPTA keys will be provided. The program meets on Saturdays from 10 am to 1 pm on campus at Penn.
