FAFSA Info for High School Seniors


The 2026-27 FAFSA is now available! Colleges and career schools use the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to determine how much financial aid you're eligible to receive, which could include grants, scholarships, work-study funds, and loans.

Who should complete the FAFSA? **Any student, regardless of income, who wants to be considered for federal, state, and school financial aid programs.** You must apply for aid every year, but with the right information in hand — and a little help from Talent Search — it's easy.

Penn Talent Search will host a virtual FAFSA Workshop on Wednesday, November 5 from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. Join us on Zoom to learn how to create an FSA ID, the difference between dependent and independent students, and more.

Advocate for Talent Search and Other TRIO Programs

Did you know that Penn Talent Search is a federal TRIO

program?

TRIO programs operate in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., the Pacific Islands, and Puerto Rico.
Collectively, more than 3,400 TRIO programs
nationwide help nearly one million students enter and graduate from college each year. Penn Talent Search alone serves 583 students in Philadelphia.

Recently, the White House issued a <u>budget</u> <u>proposal</u> that would <u>eliminate all TRIO programs</u> in the

coming year. Across the country, TRIO students could lose access to the academic advising, career guidance, and personal support that make success possible for so many first-generation and low-income students.

Policymakers in Congress need to hear from YOU — the TRIO students, parents, and families — about the importance of protecting Talent Search and other programs, so we can continue to support every one of our participants along their educational journey!

LEDA Scholars

LEDA (Leadership Enterprise for a Diverse America) is looking for highly motivated high school juniors with strong academic records and a desire to grow as leaders to join the 22nd Cohort of LEDA Scholars.

LEDA brings together a community of student leaders for a completely free five-week residential program at Princeton University and Yale University that includes:

- Academic preparation for college
- Leadership training
- SAT/ACT preparation
- Individualized college guidance
- The opportunity to experience life on a college campus

Eligibility requirements:

- Junior attending public high school in the U.S. graduating in 2027
- U.S. citizen, permanent resident (<u>meets eligible non-citizen requirements</u>), or have been granted Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status
- Annual household income under \$90,000 (assets will also be considered)
- Minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.5

arts/architecture, and mathematics (STEAM) fields. This scholarship is open to students from all backgrounds who demonstrate leadership potential, resilience, and a commitment to shaping a better future.

The number of scholarships awarded will be based on the specific needs articulated by applicants, and the **award values will range from \$1,500 to \$10,000**. Additionally, there will be up to 10 paid internships available to applicants.

To apply for this award, students must:

- be enrolled in a college, university, or post-secondary institution in the 2026-27 academic year in pursuit of a Bachelor's or Technical/Vocational degree. Funds will be issued to the institution in Summer 2026.
- pursue a STEAM major. "STEAM"
 refers to science, technology,
 engineering, arts, and mathematics. For
 the purposes of this program, it also
 includes education majors planning to
 teach STEM.
- demonstrate leadership potential and a commitment to making a positive impact in their chosen field or community or have demonstrated perseverance in overcoming challenges or barriers in pursuit of their education and career goals
